To stimulate the creation of innovative Green Care initiatives, the Green4C team has produced an interesting new opportunity, the Business Innovation Challenge (BIC). The BIC is a free competition for anyone with innovative ideas involving nature, health, and wellbeing. Participants will compete by presenting their projects ideas to promote the health and social benefits of nature. Ideas can involve one or more Green4C thematic sectors, i.e., Forest-based care, Urban green care, Social agriculture, and Green care tourism. Don't worry, you don't need to have a structured project plan, but just a draft concept.

Winners of the BIC will gain access to the **Green4C Summer School**. The Summer School is a high specialisation course taking place **in Italy** (from the 15th of June to the 8th of July 2022). Top European experts in Green Care will be sharing knowledge and best practices on entrepreneurship, forestry, nature-based solutions, health, and much more.

The aim of the School is to gain knowledge on Green Care and project development.
