

Quantitative Wood Anatomy From Sample to Data

Quantitative wood anatomy is an approach to investigate variability in xylem anatomy among species, individuals and over time, from a single year to centuries. It can be linked to water transport, carbon allocation or climate variability, and therefore plant performance and survival.
